22 Coach Klopff presented a 5K run/walk Special Event idea to the City Commission as a  
23 fundraiser for the Clio High School Football team. The Commissioners gave consensus  
24 for Coach Klopff to work with Chief Witham to design a safe route that is cost effective  
25 for the school. Coach would like the event to take place June 29, 2016 and would like  
26 to make this an annual fundraiser event for the High School. He will present a Special  
27 Event application for the next Regular City Commission meeting June 20, 2016.

29 **8. Staff Reports**

30 **City Administrator** – Wiederhold reported that a clear right-a-way is a public safety issue. Eric  
31 will also present the Commissioners at next meeting another Michigan Natural Resources Trust  
32 Fund Declaration & Notice, which is currently being modified by Consumers. Additionally,  
33 Wiederhold spoke with School Superintendent Spears regarding co-op projects in order to earn  
34 additional points for the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund grants.

35 **City Attorney** – Stout reported that he obtained the 130 E. Young Street easement. Engineer,  
36 Scott Dickerson gave Stout two additional easement requests and he is awaiting property analysis  
37 from Assessor, Carrie Bock.

38 **Chief of Police** – reported that he has five suspects responsible for the City park graffiti incident  
39 that have been identified. Chief thanked Commissioner Vance for his assistance on obtaining a  
40 \$3,000.00 grant for police equipment. The Clio Caregiver, Chris Shepherd pled guilty to fifteen  
41 counts, plus the city will receive cost recovery. Additionally, a part time officer, Erik Eckles  
42 resigned and a new part time officer, Eric Rodgers (retired Flint City officer) has been hired.

43 **Treasurer** – reminded Mayor Smith and Mayor Pro Tem Bare of bank signature appointment,  
44 Friday - June 10, 2016 at 9:00 am.

48 **City Engineer-** Dickerson had no report.

1 **Clerk** –Kingston reported that absentee voter applications were sent June 1, 2016 for both the  
2 August 2, 2016 Primary and November 8, 2016 General Elections. Kingston announced that she  
3 is taking up a collection for Deputy Clerk, Tracy Myers’ brother passing. Kingston sent a  
4 beautiful basket of flowers from the City to the funeral home. Kingston thanked the  
5 Commissioners for allowing her to attend the 2016 IIMC Annual Conference in Omaha,  
6 Nebraska. Kingston included a written synopsis report on her Conference for the Commissioners  
7 to review.

8 **DPS Superintendent-** Slocum reported that the City Park is dry.

10 **9. Commissioner comments/Committee reports**

11 **Commissioner Kovi** – reported that Flint Mayor Weaver and Drain Commissioner Jeff Wright  
12 are having a disagreement regarding the KWA. (Karegnondi Water Authority) The pipeline  
13 dispute continues as Flint Mayor Weaver wishes to stay on Detroit water and not hook up with  
14 the KWA as previous Flint City Council approved.

15 **Commissioner Mosher** – reported he received more High School Prom feedback that a Clio City  
16 Officer was responding emotional and cursing at the students.

17 **Commissioner Vance** – thanked DPS for the park project. The playscape needs new chains and  
18 swings. Flowers will be planted downtown, Tuesday, June 7, 2016 at 1:30 pm. The City is  
19 matching the same color flowers as the Township BDA.

20 **Commissioner Garcia** – thanked DPS and Director Shaun Slocum for the flags, looks great.

21 **Commissioner Williams** – asked City Administrator Wiederhold about the 306 Mill Street  
22 demolition timeline.

23 **Mayor Pro Tem Bare-** Parks & Recreation is happy with the dry park. Wished the best of luck  
24 to High School Football Coach Klopff on his 5K fundraiser run

25 **Mayor Bob Smith**— announced that if the Clio Mustangs have a winning season he will allow  
26 the players to shave his beard, downtown.
